- Ask child(ren) to share some of the things they did from the last theme.

- Picture of Joseph in prison to colour (and stick bars on) and practice writing



Activities



1. Read Bible Booklet - A Favourite Son Becomes A Slave - ' pages 1-9 or Genesis chapter 37 from the children's bible, with discussion questions for recall.
2. Child(ren) to colour picture of Joseph being sold by his brothers and practice writing words that go with picture.
3. Child(ren) to follow colour code to make picture of Joseph's multi-coloured coat. (See sheet)
Ask child(ren) if they can remember being treated unfairly by someone, or if they have treated someone that way – what did they do or could they have done to make things better? (including prayer!)

Discussion Questions

- Why did Joseph's brothers get angry with him? (Page 1 & 2)
- How could Jacob have stopped the problem between Joseph's brothers and his favourite son?
- Which one of the brothers wanted to help Joseph? (Page 5)
- What had Jacob given as a special gift to Joseph and what did his brothers do with it? (Page 6)
- Who decided to sell Joseph while Reuben was away? (Page 7)
- What did Joseph' brothers make their father think had happened to Joseph? (Page 9)

Extra Activities for Theme 12

Suggested Activities:



1. Re-read 1st part of booklet (pages 1-9) or Genesis chapter 37 from the children's bible, using discussion questions for recall. (Child(ren) can colour these pages)
2. Child(ren) can make a stand-up Joseph in his coloured coat (see accompanying sheet from Sunday School Resources.co.uk!)
3. Read 2nd part of booklet (pages 10-16) or Genesis 39 from the children's bible, using discussion questions of your making, for recall and understanding. (Talk about how Joseph behaved in a way that pleased God, even though he'd been treated wrongly, because he trusted God had a plan for him.) Ask child(ren) if anyone has ever tried to get them to do something they know is wrong (like Potiphar's wife did to Joseph). Give them an example / suggestion, and talk about what helps us to do the right thing.
4. Child(ren) can colour picture (A4) of Joseph in prison to colour (and stick bars on) and practice writing that goes with the picture.

Prayer Points






In Joseph's second dream, the sun, moon and stars bowed down to him. Even his father Jacob was angry at him for putting himself above his parents and brothers.




When Joseph arrived, his brothers grabbed him, and took off the colored coat Jacob had specially made for his favorite son. Then they threw him into the awful pit.






God gave Potiphar good harvests and many riches because of Joseph. Now an important man, Joseph still trusted and served God faithfully. But trouble came to Joseph.




